The Law School Admission Council is pleased to be associated with the Institute for China-U.S. Law & Policy Studies and with your decision to use the "Law School Admission Test for Peking University, School of Transnational Law" as part of your admission process for the upcoming academic year.

It is our understanding that you will collect the full name (given name and family name) in both Chinese and in English, the National Identification Number, and an active email address of each person registering for the test. Each candidate will also submit the testing fee to your institution. The Institute for China-U.S. Law & Policy Studies will act as PU, STL's agent for the administration of the LSAT-PUSTL and is authorized to collect the fee for this test.

The test date will be Sunday, February 12, 2012, in Beijing and Shanghai. Candidates must indicate which location they prefer when registering for the test. Once the registration and fee payment has been processed, your institution will confirm the test registration with each candidate. The candidate will take the confirmation email (or letter) along with his or her National ID card and HB (or No.2) pencils to the test center. Candidates must arrive at the time and date noted on the confirmation you provide.

Candidates may take into the test center only a clear plastic zip-lock bag, which must be stored under the chair and can be accessed only during the official break in testing time. The bag may contain only the following items: *Admission Ticket or email registration confirmation, National ID; wallet, keys, analog wristwatch, medical or hygiene products, pencils, highlighter, erasers, pencil sharpener, tissues, and beverages in plastic containers; or juice box and snacks for use during the break.*

The following items are prohibited at the test center: *electronic devices of any type, including but not limited to cell phones, electronic timers, alarms, calculators, recording devices or listening devices of any type. Backpacks, briefcases, purses, and handbags are also prohibited.*
